

## Multilingual Dangerous Goods Transport General Awareness Course

General awareness training is a requirement in most of the dangerous goods' regulatory texts. If we look at the IMDG Code as an example it requires each person to be 'trained in order to be familiar with the general provisions of dangerous goods transport provisions'. This training must include a description of the classes of dangerous goods, packing, labelling and marking of packages, placarding and marking of CTUs, documentation and transport operations including emergency response. This requirement is replicated in other regulatory texts.

NCB Hazcheck **Dangerous Goods Transport General Awareness Course** meets these training requirements included in the IMDG Code, ADR and RID Agreements, 49CFR (US) domestic regulations and also covers some of the requirements for air transport.

In addition, the same course is available in English, French and Spanish languages allowing consistent training in multiple locations.
